## PRONUNCIATION AND INTONATION TIPS

### \*FOR THE TEACHER

In a word with more than one syllable, one (or more than one) syllable will be stressed or accented. In English, not all syllables are equal.

So let's look at some examples: the word Pilot

A two syllable word, pilot. Which syllable do you think is stressed? It's the first syllable: pilot.

Another example is the word hotel. The stress falls on the second syllable: hotel.

Does word stress really matter? Absolutely. It can affect the pronunciation, it can affect the meaning of a word. Let's take for example this word. As an adjective or a noun, the stress falls on the first syllable.

Look at this example: the word present,

In present, as a verb, the stress falls on the second syllable, present.

But as a noun or adjective, the first vowel the stress falls on the first syllable, present.

Good communication is based on being understood. To work on this, take a look in Two-and three Syllable Words, and see if you can tell based on hearing which syllable is stressed.
